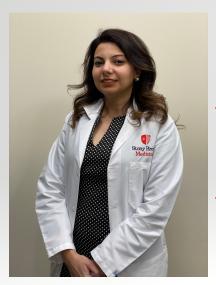

### Mental Health Corner:

Feeling stressed or overwhelmed? Recognize the signs!

Stress: the body's reaction to any change that requires response and/or adjustment

- Warning signs differ from person to person
- Physical: Fatigue, muscle aches, headache, nausea, knot in stomach
- Cognitive: Worries, concentration, distraction, ruminating
- Emotional: Fearful, worried, apathy, anger
- Behavioral: uncued crying, isolation, avoidance
- Relational: Arguments, conflict, avoidance, strained relationships
