Policy:

The Graduate Medical Education Committee (GMEC) must ensure that all residency and fellowship programs within Stony Brook Medicine comply with requirements for continuation of accreditation to provide patient care, which is required by the ACGME.

Definitions:

The Joint Commission – a U.S. based organization that accredits health care organizations and programs

Deeming Authority – the agency has the power to confirm that an institution meets Medicare and Medicaid certification requirements.

Procedures:

Stony Brook Medicine is accredited by The Joint Commission. All programs sponsored by Stony Brook Medicine must be at a primary site which is accredited by The Joint Commission and the entity has been granted deemed status for participation in Medicare under federal regulations.

If Stony Brook University Hospital or another primary or major participating loses its accreditation for patient care or recognition by another appropriate body, Stony Brook Medicine must notify the ACGME's Institutional Review Committee within 30 days with an explanation and a plan of response of such loss.

If Stony Brook University Hospital or another primary or major participating site's license is denied, suspended, or revoked, or when the aforementioned sites are required to curtail activities, or is otherwise restricted, Stony Brook Medicine must notify the ACGME's Institutional Review Committee within 30 days with an explanation and a plan of response of such loss.
