### **Policy:**

Stony Brook University Hospital is an institution whose mission includes teaching as a core mission. As such, a presumption of care in the hospital or its outpatient clinics is that the care provided to the patient will include learners at various levels. Residents participate in the care of all patients admitted to SBUH and all participating institutions, unless a patient refuses, the attending physician refuses, or the individual department policy dictates.

This policy defines resident responsibilities for patients in "non-teaching" services.

### **Definitions:**

### **Procedures:**

Individual clinical departments may delineate certain services or patients whose care does not involve trainees. Such limitations are made to allow optimal care for the patient without compromising the educational experience for the resident, and/or to prevent undue service demands from being placed on the resident. For services which have no residents assigned

to the patients, residents always respond to all emergency/urgent situations (such as Code situations, rapid response calls) as they would with any patient. Routine issues which arise in the course of patient care must be managed by non-resident practitioners on these services.
