Laurie E. Panesar, MD, Chief, Division of Pediatric Cardiology

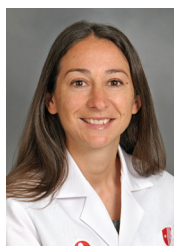

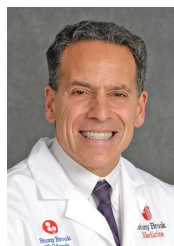
