






CPEP - New Initiatives

My experience in CPEP was helpful for my condition.










- Age range change continues

 - 95% staffed or onboarding





Eastern Long Island Hospital Behavioral Health

- Participation in SWIFT* research study in partnership with SBUH

Increased Access and Decreased Wait Time for New Patients

- Median wait time from call to visit has decreased by 50%
- Increased total new patient visits by 35%
- Average wait time for new patient appointment:
 27.8 days down from 47.2 (41% reduction)
 25% of new patients seen within 10 days
- Expanded Group Programming to Increase Access for Adult Behavioral Health Service
 79% increase in group therapy appointment
- Adult OPD services in three locations (Commack, Putnam, and Riverhead)
- Embedding of ELI Residents at Riverhead clinic starting July 21



Integration Accomplishments

- Access:
 - 104% Increase in New Patients seen in Integration Clinics
- Achievements:
 - Center for Excellence in Tics and Tourette's Disorder designation granted September 12, 2022
- Expanded Clinical Team
 - Alex Peguero-Medrano, NP increased time working with Internal Medicine
 - Melissa Rossi, MD joined in September 2021 and is providing services to OB
 - Courtney O'Brien, PhD and Veronique Deutsch-Anzalone, PhD currently transitioning to increase their time providing services to OB
 - Four Psychiatry Residents from SB and ELI participating in the third year integration elective in AY21-22 and seven participating in AY22-23





Adult OPD and Integration Goals

Adult OPD

- Increase access to psychiatric services for psychopharmacological and psychotherapeutic interventions for adult and geriatric patients.
 - Waitlist for adult behavioral health: >275 patient
 - No Internal Waitlist (SBM Referrals) for adult psychiatry
 - Waitlist for adult psychiatry community callers: >900
 - Wait list for geriatric psychiatry: >300
 - Wait list for individual psychotherapy: > 250
- Metabolic Disease Outcomes in Patients Prescribed Antipsychotics
 - Increased screening for metabolic syndrome
 - Increased Metformin use to prevent weight gain


Integration

- Continue to increase access for individual therapy
 - Waitlist is >30 patients
 - Referrals have significantly decreased due to length of wait times for therapy
- Continue to expand Clinical Integrative Network
 - Expand Collaborative Care Model, integrated behavioral health, and proactive depression screening
- Continue to develop Women's Mental Health Clinic
 - Pillars: clinical integration, evidencedbased therapy and medication management services, research
- Training/Education
 - Piloting Fourth Year Integration elective



Telepsychiatry

- Telepsych remains the most common method of treatment (84% of total visits this year)
- Transitioned to Teladoc as the primary telehealth platform
- Consent forms (in both English and Spanish) are now available digitally through Teladoc for new patients



* Telepsych data collected from March-July 2019 only, percentage is an approximation

- Developed workflows to increase access to telepsych for east end patients
- Faculty report that telepsych continues to offer flexibility, increasing satisfaction and work/life balance
- Continuing to provide inclusive and equitable care through telehealth remains a challenge and a priority



CEAD/Geriatric Psychiatry Division Goals

- Develop new CEAD satellite sites at NUMC, Catholic Health hospitals in Nassau and Suffolk, LISVH and Northport VA.
- Expand free cognitive screening clinic to 12 FQHCs.
- Expand telehealth services to ALFs.
- Engage more medical students and residents/fellows in clinical trials and research studies (3 first year medical students currently involved in COVID-19 study).
- Increase study recruitment from under-represented minority populations.
- Increase NIH grant submissions and funding for translational research in MCI/AD by collaborations with basic science researchers at SBU and other institutions.
- Establish Stony Brook Alzheimer's Disease Clinical Trials Program.
- Continue to develop the necessary core components for NIA Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (ADRC) grant application.
- Recruit geriatric psychiatrists, geriatric nurse practitioner, clinical psychologist and behavioral neurologists.





TREATMENT RESISTANT DEPRESSION (TRD)

- The Stony Brook TRD Program offers clinical and research treatments for TRD.

- 2019-current: over 140 patients treated with ketamine or esketamine for TRD
- 2021-current: 13 patients implanted with VNS devices for TRD
- 2022-current: 1st patient treated with DBS for TRD
- Research
 - 2018-2019: Esketamine for TRD/MDSI completed study
- 2020-current: VNS for TRD active study
- 2021-current: Esketamine monotherapy for TRD active study


