

Tick Bites: When to Call for Help?

The Infectious Diseases Society of America, the American College of Rheumatology, and the American Academy of Neurology recommend seeking medical attention if all three are true:


- 1. The tick was attached for 36 hours or longer
- 2. It is identified as a deer tick also called the blacklegged (Ixodes) tick
- 3. It is in a Lyme disease heavy area

If all three are true, we consider a one-time dose of doxycycline within 72-hours of removing the tick and if there are no reasons you cannot take doxycycline, such as allergy or pregnancy.

No matter what, you should watch for symptoms for many weeks after the bite. Seek medical care if you develop:

Fever, rash, headache, muscle aches, or feel unusually tired. A classic sign of Lyme disease is a red, expanding rash that may look like a bull'seye, but not everyone gets rash. Rocky Mountain spotted fever and other tick-borne diseases can cause fever and a spotted or petechial rash, and may require urgent treatment.

Have You Scheduled Your Annual Medicare Wellness Visit?

If you are enrolled in Medicare, you are eligible for an Annual Medicare Wellness Visit every 12 months. This visit is a special visit that allows you and your physician to focus on prevention, catch health issues early, and create a personalized wellness plan.

During this visit, your primary care physician will conduct important screening tests such as:

- Blood pressure check to screen for hypertension, a major risk factor for heart disease and stroke.
- **Cognitive screening** to assess memory and thinking skills and catch early signs of conditions like dementia.
- Depression screening to support mental and emotional well-being, which is essential to your overall health.
- **Hearing screening** to determine if you need to be assessed for hearing loss
- Fall risk assessment to help prevent injuries and maintain independence.
- Hearing and vision checks to catch changes that may affect your daily function and safety.
- Cancer screenings (such as screening for breast, colon, prostate or cervical cancer) – based on your age, gender, and risk factors.
- Vaccination review to ensure you're up to date on recommended shots like flu, pneumonia, shingles, and COVID-19.
- **Home and overall safety review** to determine if you need any assistance or community services.

Why is this visit important? It helps you and your physician stay ahead of potential health issues, maintain independence, and be as healthy as you can.

A note on billing: Although the Annual Wellness Visit is covered by Medicare at no cost to you when used for preventive care only. If you and your physician also address other medical concerns during the same visit, additional services may be billed, and you may have a copay or deductible. The Annual Wellness Visit can take place in the same month as the previous year. It does not have to occur on the exact calendar day of the previous year.

Do You Know? The Members of Your Care Team

There are many different members of the healthcare team who work together to deliver care to you and other patients. This team-based approach allows us to provide comprehensive, high quality, efficient, and patient-centered care.

The attending physician has completed all of their medical education and training and is licensed to practice independently. They also oversee patient care and supervise medical trainees.


Nurse practitioners (NPs) and physician assistants (PAs) are also licensed to provide similar services to physicians, such as conducting exams, ordering tests, and prescribing medications. NPs and PAs work under the supervision and collaboration of physicians to care for patients.

As Stony Brook Medicine is a teaching institution, there will be Medical Residents as well as Medical Students helping to care for you.

Resident physicians have completed their medical degree (M.D. or D.O.) and are now undergoing specialized training, taking a more active role in diagnosing and managing patient care, presenting cases to the attending physician. In our office, the residents are specializing in Internal Medicine and will be working with us for three years of training. An intern is just a special term for a first-year resident.

Medical students are in the early stages of their clinical training. They are working with the team to observe and participate in basic patient care tasks under close supervision.

Nurses support patient care through education, triage, and coordination, while medical assistants help with administrative tasks and prepare patients for their visits.
