Stony Brook Health Outreach and Medical Outreach (SB HOME) is a free, primary care clinic run by students of the Renaissance School of Medicine at Stony Brook University. The purpose of the organization is to improve the health and well-being of the underserved community in Suffolk County by increasing access to free, dependable, and comprehensive health services, empowering individuals and families through education and social services, and by training future clinicians in culturally competent and compassionate care. The Undergraduate Clinical Experience Program (UCEP) was developed under the umbrella of SB HOME with the intention to provide undergraduate and post-baccalaureate students interested in entering the healthcare field with exposure to the clinical setting, the opportunity to work with patients from diverse socioeconomic backgrounds, and the ability to learn from medical students and physicians. Students accepted into the program will be required to attend at educational sessions developed by medical students on important topics in medicine (including history taking, social determinants of health, the physical exam, ultrasonography, cardiology, radiology, and/or the interview/medical school application process) at the Health Sciences Center/Zoom. Students will also shadow clinical students and attending physicians at the SB Home Clinic. Students will be responsible for writing a 1-page, double-spaced reflection at the end of each session. **Please note that students are responsible for finding their own transportation to clinic.** (<https://renaissance.stonybrookmedicine.edu/stonybrookhome/ucep>)
